Dear Commissioners,

Part of our ongoing mission is to share our success with our community groups to help make us all stronger. In this, we offer complimentary booths for some non-profits so they can fund raise at the festival. Throughout the year, we also donate packages of musicfest swag (t-shirts, CD and tickets) to local fundraisers. We rely on the help of many community volunteers to make our event a success, and we give back to their projects. So far this year, we've given packages to an FFA fundraiser, a Sheridan Japanese School fundraiser, and a fundraiser to help a local family in fighting sexual assault.

In our first year, 2012, we donated to Friends of Family Farmers, our local Future Farmers of America, and the Tina Miller Community Center.

In 2013 Wildwood MusicFest was able to donate \$500 to the FFA and their complimentary booth earned another \$600 in sales of ice, soda and snacks. Willamina Highschool Cheerleaders painted faces and managed the bouncy house earning just under \$300 and we were able to donate the rental of the bouncy house as well as \$150 more for their fundraising efforts. We also gave the WHS music and arts program \$500 to help provide instruments and supplies that might not have had funds available to purchase. We made a contribution to The Friends of Family Farmers, a non-profit organization that stands up for the rights of small farms. We ran a raffle with Wildwood swag and raised \$500, and Hampton Lumber matched with another \$500, for Grand Sheramina Food Bank.

In 2014, we paid the FFA \$500 to do our dishes, donated an additional \$500 and they earned about \$600 on their complimentary booth. The cheerleaders joined us again in running the bouncy house and made \$300, plus we donated \$125. The Willamina Church ran a nighttime daycare and made snowcones and earned about \$600 for their Mexico Mission trip. We donated \$500 to the Tina Miller Community Center for their youth programs and \$500 to Friends of Family Farmers. We also ran a raffle with CDs donated by the musicians and Wildwood MusicFest gear which we were able to raise about \$1000 for Grand-Sheramina Food Bank. Last year we made a compilation CD where the profits go to Willamina Schools for their arts and music program. We are about to make our first donation as we just broke even!

As you can see, we have a long history of giving back to our communities. Most years we barely break even and we still give money to local groups and non-profits so we can rise up and be stronger together.




