Agency Name	Funding Request	Brief Project Summary
1) Yamhill County Emergency Management	\$39,331.00	Application requests funding for two mobile shelters; Deployed Logix Field Operations Shelters. The shelters will support and enhance existing Operational Coordination capabilities for YCARES, YCCERT and YCSO SAR. The portable shelters will allow these groups to sustain and improve their response to planned events as well as catastrophic incidents.
2) City of McMinnville, CERT	\$23,200.00	Application requests funding for the city's long-range emergency preparedness planning. They have identified a phased approach that has four components, the first of which was funded in last year's grant cycle, this application is for the remaining three components: development of "jut in time" job aids; workshop for EOC staff to review working aids, job books, IS flows and EOC staff training; tabletop exercise.
3) City of Yamhill	\$37,500.00	Application requests funding for McMinnville CERT to complete the request made last year, funding one utility trailer and equipment and training for an additional 50 volunteers. After a signed MOU the trailer would be a shared resource with YCCERT.
