Subject: Board Consideration: 3rd Amendment to Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders Services Delegation Agreement YCHHS and YCCO

Hi Mary and Laura,

Attached is an amendment to our delegation agreement with Yamhill Community Care Organization (Yamhill CCO) effective September 1, 2016. The amendment adds \$237,636 in funding for the Community Prevention and Wellness Plan effective September 1, 2016 through December 31, 2018 and extends the term of the agreement through December 31, 2018. Permission to apply for the funding was approved under Board Order #16-341. This revenue was not included in our Health and Human Services 2016-2017 Adopted Budget, however, we have sufficient expense authority. In addition, I am requesting approval of an additional 1.0 FTE for a Management Analyst in the HHS position management roster to be assigned to the Public Health Division.

1. If approved, the funding will provide for staff coordination of two programs in elementary and middle schools throughout the county. The programs, The Good Behavior Game and The Family Check Up, are evidence based and aim to improve kids self-regulation and positive behavior. The overall goal of Yamhill CCO with the project is to improve health and education outcomes, especially for vulnerable or high risk youth. In addition to the school program coordination, the funding will provide coordination with prenatal providers for a prenatal tobacco cessation pilot program, as well as ongoing oversight and development of the Maternal Medical Home model of care. These activities are a continuation of strategic goals of Yamhill CCO and align with Yamhill County HHS core prevention activities. For context, Lindsey Manfrin has been providing support to the Maternal Medical Home model development in an "in kind" capacity and, if successful, this will provide some capacity funds to support this work moving forward.

I recommend the Board approve this amendment, as well as the addition of 1.0 FTE for a Management Analyst. Please let me know if you have any questions.
