Hi Mary and Laura,

I would like to request permission to apply for a Treatment Court Grant administered by the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission. Our proposal will support the expansion of our Women's Recovery Court by incorporating public health nursing support, enhancing recovery peer support services by Certified Recovery Mentors and increasing the number of participants from 15 to 20. The grant request will be for approximately \$131,400 for the 2017-2019 biennium with an official start date of July 1, 2017. Our current grant ends June 30, 2017.

The Women's Recovery Court assists clients in successfully accomplishing drug court requirements and parenting their children while living a clean and sober, crime-free life in the community. The target population is adult women who are pregnant or parenting with high substance abuse treatment needs at medium to high risk to recidivate.

If our grant application is successful, I will return to the Board to request approval for the actual amount awarded. The Health and Human Services Adopt budget will be adjusted to include this amount.
