

**FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT
FOR PEER LED SERVICES
CHAMPION TEAM**

THIS FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT (“Amendment #4”) is made effective January 1, 2019 between Yamhill County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon acting by and through its Board of Commissioners and its Health and Human Services Department, Behavioral Health Programs (“County”) and Champion Team (“Contractor”), an Oregon nonprofit corporation, PO Box 1634, 1300 Adams Street, Suite B, McMinnville, OR 97128.

RECITALS:

A. County and Contractor are parties to that certain agreement dated as of January 29, 2015 (the “Underlying Agreement”), pursuant to which Contractor provides peer support services. The Underlying Agreement is memorialized in Yamhill County records as Board Order 15-23. The Underlying Agreement was first amended on January 20, 2016, memorialized as Board Order 16-07 (“Amendment #1”). The Underlying Agreement was further amended on December 21, 2016, memorialized as Board Order 17-510 (“Amendment #2”) and on December 21, 2017 (Amendment #3).

B. County and Contractor now desire to further amend the Underlying Agreement upon the terms and conditions as more particularly set forth herein below.

C. Capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meanings attributed to such terms in the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein below and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties hereto, County and Contractor, intending legally to be bound, hereby agree as follows:

1. Section 1 “Effective Date” of the Underlying Agreement as last amended by Amendment #3 is hereby amended to extend the term of the agreement through December 31, 2019.
2. Section 2 “Contractor’s Services” of the Underlying Agreement as last amended by Amendment #3 is hereby amended to include the Scope of Services as detailed in “January-December 2019 Peer-Led Proposal” which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and which is incorporated herein by this reference.
3. The balance of Section 2 of the Underlying Agreement as last amended by Amendment #3 remains unchanged.

4. Section 6 "Payment of the Contract" of the Underlying Agreement as last amended by Amendment #3 is hereby amended to include the following:

5. "A. **Compensation for Services.** As compensation for performing the Services required by Exhibit A, following receipt and approval of billing documents, Contractor shall receive a monthly payment of \$11,445.93 per month for the period of January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2020. The maximum amount payable under this Agreement for the period of January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2010 is \$137,350. The maximum amount payable for performance of Services under this Agreement is now \$712,140.60.

6. The remainder of Section 6 of the Underlying Agreement as last amended by Amendment #3 remains unchanged.

7. Section 18 "Non-discrimination" of the Underlying Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: "Contractor agrees that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, age, or other category protected by Oregon or federal law suffer discrimination in the performance of this Agreement when employed by Contractor."

8. The balance of the Underlying Agreement remains unchanged.

9. **Ratification.** Except as otherwise expressly modified by the terms of this Amendment #4, the Underlying Agreement shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect. All terms, covenants and conditions of the Underlying Agreement not expressly modified herein are hereby confirmed and ratified and remain in full force and effect, and, as further amended hereby, constitute valid and binding obligations of Contractor enforceable according to the terms thereof.

10. **Authority.** County and Contractor and each of the persons executing this Amendment #4 on behalf of County and Contractor hereby covenants and warrants that: (i) such party has full right and authority to enter into this Amendment #4 and has taken all action required to authorize such party (and each person executing this Amendment #4 on behalf of such party) to enter into this Amendment #4, and (ii) the person signing on behalf of such party is authorized to do so on behalf of such entity.

11. **Binding Effect.** All of the covenants contained in this Amendment #4 shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, legal representatives and permitted successors and assigns.

12. **Counterparts.** This Amendment #4 may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same Amendment #4.

13. **Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are intended to be a material part of this Amendment #4 and are incorporated herein by this reference.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed, or caused to be executed on the date indicated by their duly authorized officials, this Amendment #4 in duplicate, each of which shall be deemed an original on the date executed by all parties.

Exhibit A

January-December 2019 Peer Led Proposal

Scope of Practice

- A. Champion Team is a peer-run organization developed to promote personal growth, recovery and wellness for adults in Yamhill County with mental diversity and co-occurring challenges of homelessness, addictions, and/or incarceration. Champion Team provides an environment for peer-run services at 1300 NW Adams St. Suite B. McMinnville, OR 97128.
- B. The Board-of-Directors is being built up to be comprised of over 60% membership having lived experience with mental diversity and/or co-occurring challenges. Would like to have 40% of board members be local professionals and/or community members at large.
- C. Champion Team has demonstrated capability by providing and creating ongoing peer support services. Champion Team is a hub-through the activities, peer led groups, peer support services and authentic interactions-individuals connect to the broader mental health community. Every effort is made to include the many community partners and resources Yamhill County provides.
- D. Champion Team has provided support to many individuals that participated in one or more programs and/or services. The amount of people coming to the center has increased approx. 400% since October 2017. Champion Team tracks the number of individual participants with Oregon Health Plan. This data is reported quarterly to ensure performance and monitoring.
- E. Champion Team plays an important role within the peer services and broader Yamhill County community. Champion Team is the only peer-run organization in Yamhill County with a drop-in center in addition to other services that compliment all the other local partners i.e. Yamhill County Behavioral Health, Provoking Hope, Project ABLE, Yamhill County Court programs, mental health providers, and parole/probation. Collaboration with partners include the sharing of resources and services provided to benefit Oregon Health Plan recipients.
- F. Champion Team is managing the Car Park Program-partnering with the city
- G. Collaboration with Capitol Dental to provide dental services to Oregon Health Plan members, offering peer support to members that want support throughout entire dental experience.
- H. **Blessings Too** provides clothing to Champion Team members and the community at large.
- I. Provide food for members daily (food provided by Salvation Army and WinCo. 1st Federal Bank grant of \$1000 for food)
- J. DDA meetings are held at Champion Team four times a week
- K. Art Group-is run twice a week by Dena Winn, an art student working on her master's degree.
- L. Beyond the Bars-Received a grant from Oregon Humanities for \$1500. Creating Release Packages for people getting out of prison or jail, putting together a jail friendly job fair.
- M. Women's Empowerment Support Series-several groups through out the week are focused on Women's Empowerment. Shawn Brown has been successfully running this program. She worked as the domestic violence advocate for Henderson House for eight years.
- N. Thursday Crock Pot Dinners have evolved into Champion Team taking over management of Piecing the Community Together (PCT) in partnership with Hope on the Hill.

Proposed Projects

1. Future plans for partnerships, collaborations and/or involvement with Yamhill County in existing or creating harm reduction and suicide prevention programs
2. 2019 hiring a peer support specialist and training them as an OHP Assister to worker to strengthen our dental program and working with HHS and other community partners to assist people with their OHP needs: signing up for services, reapplying after lapse or incarceration and assisting with any questions about coverage.
3. Continue researching and applying for outside funding sources.
4. Meeting with Emily Johnson from the CCO to discuss some partnering/collaborations for 2019 next week.

Drop-In Center Operations

- The drop-in center is located at 1300 NW Adams – Suite B in McMinnville provides Champion Team with large meeting facilities, a reception and waiting area, kitchen, social room, relaxation room, resource room with two computers, all purpose room, two bathrooms/three toilets, a supply closet, two offices, a dental satellite office, two large basement spaces. The request to support our facilities is a monthly amount of \$2300 for rent and \$300 in utilities.
- To continue operating at our seven day a week schedule, we always need to have two staff on the floor for safety and to accommodate growth, mental health crisis, and other unexpected events. In 2019 Champion Team will employ an Executive Director FTE, PSS/Assister FTE, PSS/Life Enrichment PTE, PSS volunteer staff FTE, two Easter Seals Participants at 24 hrs. each, bookkeeper (PSS) PTE
- Heather Hunter donating Netflix
- Scott Hibbler donating the entertainment equipment
- Grants and donations will be used to fund groups, projects, art supplies and outings.
