Hi Commissioners, Laura, Ken:

Attached is amendment #7 to our delegation agreement (BO 14-706) with Yamhill Community Care Organization (Yamhill CCO). The amendment reflects the changes to services and rates effective January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 and references Yamhill CCO's base contract with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA). The rates reflect a 2.0% increase on base mental health and substance use disorder treatment services and some additional specific service level increases that OHA is trying to adjust for newer lines of business such as Cover all Kids, as well as a 2017 1% premium contribution to the Community Prevention Wellness fund which is an action Yamhill CCO is requesting of any Risk Accepting Entity. Unlike last year where we received a significant reduction in flexible services allocation following a Board decision by the Yamhill Community Care Organization (Yamhill CCO), this proposed amendment contains a 2.0% increase on flexible services per member per month reimbursement. Additionally, the proposed amendment contains the following new activities:

- Behavioral Health payment for behavioral health services in Patient-Centered Primary Care Home (PCPCH) will be paid at Oregon Health Authority Medical Assistance Program (DMAP) Fee for Service (FFS) rates by Yamhill County Health and Human Services (HHS) to credentialed providers who appropriately document medical necessity as required under Medicaid rules and Oregon Revised Statutes and Oregon Administrative Rules.
- Language to continue our work to develop Value Based Payment and participate in the Pay for Performance (P4P) program, including the provider network that HHS manages under this contract.
- Additional one time allocation to Community Prevention and Wellness fund of \$394,495. A portion of these funds are related to the earning of 2017 P4P funds (approximately 25% or \$133,495) and the other funds (\$261,000) are from received Marijuana Tax funds as outlined for use under the Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account Oregon Revised Statute 480.380.
- Add contracted .5 fulltime equivalent (FTE) staff to work on a coordinated Community Health Assessment and Community Health Improvement Plan and this will include working with our local non-profit hospital Providence Newberg Medical Center; payment to HHS of \$50,204.

We based our HHS 2018-2019 Adopted Budget on projected rates and we have sufficient expense authority. As noted above, I am also requesting the additional midyear .5 FTE Management Analyst be added to our position management roster.

If approved, this amendment continues our existing contractual relationship with Yamhill CCO to provide delegated mental health and substance use disorder treatment services for a membership of nearly 25,000 individuals within Yamhill County. Under the agreement, HHS accepts the risk and responsibility to provide the health benefits associated with these services through a network of local and regional providers. By utilizing a strong model of public and private providers we are uniquely poised to impact the health and wellbeing of these Yamhill CCO members, as well as build programs that utilize other funding streams such as state and local contracts to increase safety net services for all residents of Yamhill County.

I recommend the Board approve this amendment as written. Please let me know if you have any questions.
