Subject: Board Consideration: Promoting Integration of Primary and Behavioral Health Care (PIPBHC) Grant

Hi Mary and Ken,

I am requesting the Board's permission to apply for the Promoting Integration of Primary and Behavioral Health Care (PIPBHC) Grant offered through the Oregon Health Authority. The application is due Monday, April 15, 2019. If awarded, the grant will provide \$190,000 per calendar year, from 2019 to 2023, to support Yamhill County Health and Human Services' aims as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC). As you may recall, CCBHC clinic status allows our team to provide whole person integrated care on our primary clinics in Newberg and McMinnville and is an eight state Federal demonstration grant.

If funded, this grant will afford the opportunity to increase integration and collaboration between primary and behavioral healthcare through offering care services related to screening, diagnosis, prevention, and treatment for adults with a Serious Mental Illness (SMI), Serious Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI), and/or at risk of co-occurring chronic conditions or substance use disorder. If our grant application is successful, I will return to the Board to request approval for the amount awarded and it will either fall under our fiscal year 19-20 new state grant Adopted expense authority or, if notified early, I will request the changes to our budget prior to adoption.
