

**FIRST AMENDMENT TO MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE  
ABUSE DISORDER SERVICES AGREEMENT**

This First Amendment to Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorder Services Agreement (this "First Amendment") dated this 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 2020, is entered by and between Yamhill Community Care Organization (hereinafter "YCCO"), and Yamhill County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon, acting by and through Yamhill County Health and Human Services Department (hereinafter "YHHS").

**RECITALS:**

A. YCCO and YHHS entered a Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorder Services Agreement dated January 1, 2020.

B. The purpose of this First Amendment is to amend the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorder Services Agreement effective March 1, 2020.

C. Capitalized terms used in this First Amendment, but not otherwise defined in this First Amendment shall have the same meaning as those in the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorder Services Agreement, and the CCO Contract, in that order of priority.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

1. Effective Date. The Effective Date of this First Amendment shall be March 1, 2020.

3. Modifications. The original Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorder Services Agreement is hereby amended, modified and supplemented as set forth in this First Amendment and incorporated herein by this reference.

4. Exhibit A, Compensation. The YCCO shall make a one-time payment to YHHS in the amount of \$144,088 for behavioral health initiatives in Yamhill County schools. Funding will be tied directly to the Student Success Act to help fund the addition of full-time employees that will provide mental health outpatient services for all students.

The YCCO funding of the Student Success Act will be used to support the following initiatives:

• Dedicated therapist based at each school	• Skills training on and/or off campus
• Consultations with school staff	• School-based parent education and support
• Behavior support	• Social and behavioral skill-building groups
• Case management	• Staff training on mental health topics and in-class interventions

5. Ratification. Except as expressly amended in writing and signed by both parties, the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorder Services Agreement is hereby ratified and affirmed, and shall remain in full force and effect according to its terms.
