Re: FEMA-4562-DR-OR - Wildfires and Straight-Line Winds (Chehalem Mountain/Bald Peak Fire)

Attached please find the *Subrecipient Certification for Small Projects with Completed Work* and affiliated worksheets for submission under the FEMA-4562-DR-OR reimbursement grant, between Yamhill County and the Federal Emergency Management Agency through the Oregon Military Department, Office of Emergency Management. This is the final component of the FEMA reimbursement grant for which Yamhill County qualifies. Yamhill County Emergency Management has worked in concert with FEMA to determine the County's eligible reimbursement expenses of \$19,603.92 for emergency protective measures that were deployed during the Chehalem Mountain/Bald Peak Fire. The expenses are for staffing in the Sheriff's Office Enforcement and Operations divisions, which included detectives, Rural Patrol, and Emergency Management. The OEM Infrastructure Contract was previously approved as B.O. 21-05.
