

Dear Fellow Yamhill County Voters:

I am pleased to present to you a Yamhill County Voters' Pamphlet for the May 18, 2004, Primary Election. The Yamhill County Voters' Pamphlet is published to provide a forum for candidates and the important issues being presented to you, the voters. Ballot Titles and Explanatory Statements are prepared by the jurisdiction submitting each measure to the voters and are subject to appeal to the circuit court. No appeals were filed for the ballot titles or explanatory statements in this voters' pamphlet. Candidate statements and measure arguments are included in this pamphlet by the payment of a fee. Candidates are arranged in order in the pamphlet and on the ballot according to a random alphabet established by the Secretary of State for each election. Not all candidates choose to submit candidate statements and appear in the voter pamphlet. The text of each statement or argument is printed exactly as submitted by the author, no corrections are made by Yamhill County for punctuation, grammar, syntax errors or inaccurate information. The persons submitting the statements and arguments for the voter pamphlet are solely responsible for the content.

You will note that the offices of Yamhill County Treasurer and Yamhill County Clerk do not appear in this pamphlet nor on your ballot. The Treasurer and Clerk are constitutional offices that must be elected in the General Election. Since only one candidate filed for each of these offices, the candidates have been declared nominated and will appear on the November General Election ballot. The office of Assessor is not a constitutional office and thus appears on your Primary election ballot and will be elected in the Primary election.

"Official Ballot Drop Sites" have been designated in each city in the county. Look for the list of official drop sites in this pamphlet. You may take your ballot to any drop site listed, 24 hours per day. **If you mail your ballot, the postage required is 37¢. Ballots deposited in an official drop site are postage free.** Remember, **postmarks do not count**; your ballot must be in an Official Ballot Drop Site or the office of the County Clerk by **8:00 P.M. election day, May 18.**

Any voter who needs assistance in voting because of any disability is invited to contact me or my staff. We will make every attempt to meet your voting needs.

We hope that you will take time to become informed on the issues and exercise your right to vote in every election.

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VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

When you get your ballot packet in the mail, immediately examine it to make certain it is complete. It should contain the following items:

- * A printed ballot on which you may vote your choices;
- * A secrecy envelope with voting instructions printed on it;
- * A pre-addressed return envelope in which to return your ballot;
- * (If qualified) Precinct Committeeperson ballot.

If any items are missing or if you spoil your ballot, contact the Yamhill County Clerk's Office, 503-434-7518, and a replacement ballot pack will be sent to you.

Follow the voting instructions on the secrecy envelope.

After voting, fold your ballot along the pre-scored folds and insert it into the secrecy envelope.

Seal the return envelope and sign the statement on the back of the envelope. Your ballot will not be counted if your envelope is not signed.

Take the ballot return envelope to any "Official Ballot Drop Site" listed in this Yamhill County Voters' Pamphlet - OR...

Place the appropriate first class postage of 37¢ on the return envelope and mail it so that it is received in the Yamhill County Clerk's Office not later than 8:00 p.m., May 18, 2004.

If you make an error on your ballot, spoil it in any way or lose it, you may obtain a replacement ballot by contacting the Yamhill County Clerk's Office at 503-434-7518.



How to Determine Your Precinct Number in Order to Vote Your Precinct Committeeperson Ballot:

Reading from left to right on your address label, the precinct number is the 3rd group of 4 numbers, in a series of numbers, above your name on the ballot return envelope.




Voting Your Ballot

To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on the ballot, with a #2 pencil or a black ball point pen, simply connect the arrow next to the candidate of your choice.

To vote for a candidate whose name is **not** printed on the ballot, under the heading of the appropriate office, write the person's name on the (WRITE-IN) line provided. Then complete the arrow pointing to the write-in line. **You must connect the arrow to insure that your write-in vote is tallied.**

**A MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF
THE ANGEVINE/KIZER/SZEDLAK
PROPERTY**

QUESTION: Shall the Angevine/Kizer/Szedlak property, located north of Grandhaven Street and east of Grandhaven Drive, be annexed to McMinnville?

SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would annex an 11.31-acre parcel of land to the City of McMinnville. The property is generally located north of Grandhaven Street and east of Grandhaven Drive. The property is further described as Tax Lot 4600, Section 9, T. 4 S., R. 4 W., W. M. This property is within the McMinnville Urban Growth Boundary and borders the existing city limit line on the south, east, and west. The McMinnville Comprehensive Plan, adopted in 1981, designates this property for residential use. If annexed, the owner proposes to plat within this property 45 single-family lots ranging in size from approximately 6,300 square feet to 29,200 square feet; the average lot size within this proposed development would be approximately 8,600 square feet. Approval of this annexation does not authorize development of this property; approval of future development plans requires compliance with applicable state and federal regulations as well as with the McMinnville Zoning Ordinance, Land Division Ordinance, and other applicable city regulations in effect at the time.

**NO ARGUMENTS WERE
FILED IN SUPPORT OF OR
IN OPPOSITION TO THIS
MEASURE**

On November 20, 2003, the McMinnville Planning Commission held a hearing to consider a request from Wildcat Investment Properties LLC to annex a parcel of land approximately 11.31 acres in size to the City of McMinnville. The property is generally located north of Grandhaven Street and east of Grandhaven Drive, and is further described as Tax Lot 4600, Section 9, T. 4 S., R. 4 W., W.M. This property is within the McMinnville Urban Growth Boundary, and borders the existing McMinnville city limit line on the south, east, and west.

At the conclusion of this hearing, the Planning Commission forwarded to the City Council a recommendation that the subject property, referred to as the Angevine/Kizer/Szedlak property, be annexed to the City of McMinnville, and be withdrawn from the McMinnville Rural Fire Protection District, subject to voter approval.


The City Council, upon review of the Planning Commission hearing record, on December 9, 2003, adopted Ordinance No. 4799 finding that the request for annexation of the Angevine/Kizer/Szedlak property met the land use and annexation ordinance criteria of the City of McMinnville. This ordinance also directed the City staff to prepare the ballot title and explanatory statement to be submitted to the Yamhill County Clerk for the May 18, 2004, election.

The general land use plan for the Angevine/Kizer/Szedlak property, which is the subject of this annexation request, proposes that the 11.31-acre subject site would be platted for approximately 45 single-family homes. The average lot size within this proposed development would be approximately 8,600 square feet. Approval of this annexation does not authorize development of this property; approval of future development plans requires compliance with applicable state and federal regulations as well as with the McMinnville Zoning Ordinance, Land Division Ordinance, and other applicable city regulations in effect at the time.

**A MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF
THE BRENTANO PROPERTY**

QUESTION: Shall the Brentano property, located northwest of the Oak Ridge subdivision and south of Baker Creek, be annexed to McMinnville?

SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would annex a 22.48-acre parcel of land to the City of McMinnville. The property is generally located north of Pinot Noir Drive, and south of Baker Creek. The property is further described as a portion of Tax Lot 600, Sections 7 and 8, T. 4 S., R. 4 W., W.M. This property is within the McMinnville Urban Growth Boundary and borders the existing city limit line on the south. The McMinnville Comprehensive Plan, adopted in 1981, designates this property for residential use. If annexed, the owner proposes to plat within this property approximately 76 single-family lots. The smallest of these lots would be 6,000 square feet in size; larger lots would be located around the property's perimeter in order to accommodate existing vegetation and slope. Approval of this annexation does not authorize development of this property; approval of future development plans requires compliance with applicable state and federal regulations as well as with the McMinnville Zoning Ordinance, Land Division Ordinance, and other applicable city regulations in effect at the time.

FILED IN SUPPORT OF OR
IN OPPOSITION TO THIS
MEASURE**

On November 20, 2003, the McMinnville Planning Commission held a hearing to consider a request from Premier Development LLC to annex a parcel of land approximately 22.48 acres in size to the City of McMinnville. The property is generally located north of Baker Creek Road, south of Baker Creek, and northwest of the Oak Ridge residential subdivision, and is further described as a portion of Tax Lot 600, Sections 7 and 8, T. 4 S., R. 4 W., W.M. This property is within the McMinnville Urban Growth Boundary, and borders the existing McMinnville city limit line on the south.

At the conclusion of this hearing, the Planning Commission forwarded to the City Council a recommendation that the Brentano property be annexed to the City of McMinnville, and be withdrawn from the McMinnville Rural Fire Protection District, subject to voter approval.


The City Council, upon review of the Planning Commission hearing record, on December 9, 2003, adopted Ordinance No. 4798 finding that the request for annexation of the Brentano property met the land use and annexation ordinance criteria of the City of McMinnville. This ordinance also directed the City staff to prepare the ballot title and explanatory statement to be submitted to the Yamhill County Clerk for the May 18, 2004, election.

The general land use plan for the Brentano property, which is the subject of this annexation request, proposes that the 22.48-acre subject site would be platted for approximately 76 single-family homes. The smallest of these lots would be 6,000 square feet in size; larger lots would be located around the property's perimeter in order to accommodate existing vegetation and slope. Approval of this annexation does not authorize development of this property; approval of future development plans requires compliance with applicable state and federal regulations as well as with the McMinnville Zoning Ordinance, Land Division Ordinance, and other applicable city regulations in effect at the time.

<p align="center">MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF THE RUDEN PROPERTY</p> <p>QUESTION: Shall the Ruden property, located north of the Park Meadows Subdivision and east of Hill Road, be annexed to McMinnville?</p> <p>SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would annex a 17.93-acre parcel of land to the City of McMinnville. The property is generally located north of the Park Meadows Subdivision, and east of Hill Road and the Cottonwood Subdivision. The property is further described as a portion of Tax Lot 300, Section 18, T. 4 S., R. 4 W., W.M. This property is within the McMinnville Urban Growth Boundary and borders the existing city limit line on the north and west. The McMinnville Comprehensive Plan, adopted in 1981, designates this property for residential use. If annexed, the owner proposes to plat approximately 15 acres of the property into 52 single-family lots, averaging approximately 7,000 square feet in size. On the remaining 2.75 acres of the property is proposed 38 to 55 multi-family units. Approval of this annexation does not authorize development of this property; approval of future development plans requires compliance with applicable state and federal regulations as well as with the McMinnville Zoning Ordinance, Land Division Ordinance, and other applicable city regulations in effect at the time.</p> <p align="center">NO ARGUMENTS WERE FILED IN SUPPORT OF OR IN OPPOSITION TO THIS MEASURE</p>	<p>On December 18, 2003, the McMinnville Planning Commission held a hearing to consider a request from Alan Ruden to annex a parcel of land approximately 17.93 acres in size to the City of McMinnville. The property is generally located east of Hill Road, south of Baker Creek Road, and north of the Park Meadows subdivision, and is further described as a portion of Tax Lot 300, Section 18, T. 4 S., R. 4 W., W.M. This property is within the McMinnville Urban Growth Boundary, and borders the existing McMinnville city limit line on the west.</p> <p>At the conclusion of this hearing, the Planning Commission forwarded to the City Council a recommendation that the Ruden property be annexed to the City of McMinnville, and be withdrawn from the McMinnville Rural Fire Protection District, subject to voter approval.</p> <p>The City Council, upon review of the Planning Commission hearing record, on January 27, 2004, adopted Ordinance No. 4801 finding that the request for annexation of the Ruden property met the land use and annexation ordinance criteria of the City of McMinnville. This ordinance also directed the City staff to prepare the ballot title and explanatory statement to be submitted to the Yamhill County Clerk for the May 18, 2004, election.</p> <p>The general land use plan for the Ruden property, which is the subject of this annexation request, proposes that approximately 15 acres of the subject site would be platted for 52 single-family lots, and that 38 to 55 multi-family units would be built on the remaining 2.75 acres.</p> <p>Approval of this annexation does not authorize development of this property; approval of future development plans requires compliance with applicable state and federal regulations as well as with the McMinnville Zoning Ordinance, Land Division Ordinance, and other applicable city regulations in effect at the time.</p> <p align="right"><i>Submitted by Kent L. 

<p align="center">MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF 3.3 ACRES (FOUR PARCELS) INTO NEWBERG</p> <p>QUESTION: Should Newberg annex approximately 3.3 acres located at 1201, 1203-B, 1203-C, and 1303 North Main?</p> <p>SUMMARY: This measure would annex four parcels to the City of Newberg. The parcels are west of current City limits. The parcels are proposed to be zoned R-1 (Low Density Residential). If these parcels are annexed into the city, the parcels would be withdrawn from the Newberg Rural Fire Protection District.</p> <p>Three of the four parcels contain single-family homes and are currently occupied. The remaining parcel plan shows three new potential lots to be built with access off of Creekside Lane. The maximum number of units allowed in the zone would be 13. Three parcels will also connect to the City sanitary sewer services. The fourth parcel is already connected to the City sanitary sewer services.</p> <p>The owners of the four parcels have requested that the City of Newberg annex the properties.</p> <p>The Newberg City Council determined that the application met land use approval criteria. The City Charter requires annexations to be approved by the electorate of the city.</p> <p align="center">NO ARGUMENTS WERE FILED IN SUPPORT OF OR IN OPPOSITION TO THIS MEASURE</p>	<p>EFFECT OF PASSAGE: If this measure passes, four parcels which consist of 3.3 acres would be incorporated into the City limits of the City of Newberg. The parcels would be withdrawn from the Newberg Rural Fire Protection District.</p> <p>BACKGROUND: This measure would annex four parcels to the City of Newberg. All of the parcels are west of the current Newberg city limits, and are bounded by the City limits on the north, east and south sides. Three of the four parcels contain single-family homes and are currently occupied. All four parcels are connected to the City water system on a hardship basis. As a condition of such connections, owners were required to apply to annex the parcels into the city. One parcel in a concept development plan shows three new potential lots to be built with access off of Creekside Lane. The maximum number of units allowed in the zone, using all 3.3 acres, would be 13. Three parcels will also connect to the City sanitary sewer services. The fourth parcel is already connected to the City sanitary sewer services.</p> <p>The parcel owners are Dean L. Hulse, Samuel L. Hulse, Kay and Larry Church, and Scott McLean. The owners requested that the City of Newberg annex the properties.</p> <p>All of the properties are within the Newberg Urban Growth Boundary. The properties are proposed to be zoned as R-1 (Low Density Residential).</p> <p>The Newberg City Council determined that the application has met the land use criteria for approval and that development of the parcels will allow and provide adequate resources for the extension of public infrastructure and City services to the annexation area.</p> <p>The City Charter provides that annexations must be approved by a majority vote of the electorate of the City. The Council referred this matter to the May 18, 2004, election. Applicants/owners are required to pay their proportionate share of election costs.</p> <p>Copies of the reports, minutes of the hearing, and an exact legal description are available at the Newberg Community Development Department located at City Hall - 414 East First Street, Newberg, Oregon.</p> <p>EFFECT OF FAILURE: If this measure fails, the four parcels would not be part of the City of Newberg but remain in Yamhill County outside the city limits, and the parcels would remain in the Newberg Rural Fire Protection District.</p> <p align="right"><i>Submitted by James H. 

The road would also be withdrawn from the Newberg Rural Fire Protection District.</p> <p>BACKGROUND: This measure would annex the Fernwood Road right-of-way from Springbrook Road east to the Eastern Fork of Springbrook Creek. This annexation would bring Fernwood Road into the City limits and allow the City to take over jurisdiction of Fernwood Road. The road is south of the current City limits. General Information

Vote-by-Mail

What is Vote-by-Mail?

Vote-by-mail is a method of conducting elections. Instead of using traditional polling places where voters go to cast ballots on election day, a ballot is automatically mailed to each registered voter. The ballot is then voted and returned to the county elections official to be counted.

As a voter, what do I have to do?

Your ballot packet will automatically be mailed to you between April 30 and May 4, 2004. Inside the packet you will find the ballot, a secrecy envelope and a return envelope. Once you vote the ballot, place it in the secrecy envelope and seal it in the pre-addressed return envelope. Be sure you sign the return envelope on the appropriate line. After that just return the ballot either by mail or at a designated drop site.

What if I am uncomfortable voting my ballot at home?

Privacy booths are available for you to cast your ballot. There are privacy booths at your county elections office and there may be others at drop site locations elsewhere in your county. For further information, call your county elections official.

What if my ballot doesn't come?

If you are registered to vote and have not received your ballot within a week after they are mailed, call your county elections office. They will check that your voter registration is current. If it is, they will mail you a replacement ballot.

What if I have moved and have not updated my registration?

If you were registered to vote by April 27 but now have a different address, call your county elections office for instructions on how to update your registration and receive a ballot.

Do I have to return my ballot by mail?

You have the choice of mailing your ballot or returning it to any county elections office or any designated drop site in the state. The times and locations of drop sites are available at your county elections office.

How much postage is required to mail the ballot back?

Your voted ballot can usually be returned using a single 37¢ stamp. In those instances where additional postage is necessary, it will be clearly indicated on the ballot materials.

When must the voted ballot be returned?

The voted ballot must be received in any county elections office or designated drop site by 8:00 p.m. on election night.

Postmarks do not count!

How do I know if my ballot is received?

You can call your county elections office and ask if they received your ballot. A record is kept showing each voter whose ballot has been returned.

Can anyone find out how I've voted once I mail my ballot?

No. All ballots are separated from the return envelope before the ballots are inspected. This process ensures confidentiality.

What if I forget to sign the return envelope?

Generally, your elections office will either return it to you for signing or they will contact you, if possible, to come to the elections office to sign it. If the return envelope does not get signed before 8:00 p.m. on May 18, the ballot will not be counted.

Can the public watch the election process?

All steps of the process are open to observation by the public. Contact your county elections official to make arrangements.

When will election results be known?

Ballot counting cannot begin until election day. Initial results are released at 8:00 p.m. election night and will continue to be updated through election night until all ballots have been counted.

Voters with Disabilities

If you are unable to vote your ballot without assistance because of a physical disability or because you are unable to read or write, contact your county elections official. They will provide two persons to assist you in voting. In order to assure the county receives your voted ballot by election day, contact your county elections office early to arrange for assistance. You may also select someone else of your own choice to assist you.

A cassette edition of the Voters' Pamphlet is available for Oregonians who cannot read standard print due to a visual or physical disability. To order a cassette of the Voters' Pamphlet, please contact Independent Living Resources at 503-232-7411.

Primary Elections

At the May Primary Election, the two major political parties (Democratic and Republican) nominate candidates to appear on the General Election ballot.

In 2004, Oregon's Democratic and Republican parties have chosen to nominate their candidates in a "closed primary" election. In a "closed primary" election only persons who are registered members of a major political party may vote the ballot of that political party.

Persons registered as not affiliated with a political party will receive a ballot with measure and nonpartisan candidate information.

Important!

If your ballot is lost, destroyed, damaged or you make a mistake in marking your ballot, you may call your county elections office and request a replacement ballot. One will be mailed to you as long as you request it by May 13. After that, you may pick it up at the elections office. If you have already mailed your original ballot before you realize you made a mistake, you have cast your vote and will not be eligible for a replacement ballot.

Your voted ballot must be returned to your county elections office by election day, Tuesday, May 18, 2004.

Postmarks do not count!

County elections offices are open on election day from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.


